Current Landscape

Complex research is increasingly conducted by teams and networks. Individual faculty members have collaborative networks, and networks can be focused on specific topics within and across institutions. Institutional Challenges

Individual researchers and administrators both understand the value of collaborative networks, but face challenges in taking full advantage of connections.

- Collaborative networks often are not visible. Scholars may not know that a network exists or may not be aware which colleagues have collaborated with each other, or share interests and could potentially collaborate on future projects.
- Smaller networks on a campus may be isolated.
- There may be gaps in teams or networks. Addressing these gaps could strengthen connections, improve the research, and help attain research funding.
- To date, there is a dearth of tools to help administrators quickly and easily identify and analyze collaborations. Learning about networks has been through word of mouth.
